


## Learn a song Hungry Billy Goats Gruff Song




*(Sing to the tune of 'I'm a Little Teapot'.)*

<p align="center">   <b>Be Kind</b> </p> <p>The Troll was very unkind to the three Billy Goats. Talk to a grown up about the unkind things s/he did and said. Think of some things s/he could do instead, to be friendly to the goats.</p>	<p align="center">  </p> <p>See if you can make a troll. You might like to paint one or make it from recycled materials. Is s/he going to be grumpy like the one in the story?</p>	<p align="center">  </p> <p>See if you can find some things around your home or garden that begin with the sound 'g'. Here are a few ideas... grass, grape, glass, goat, gorilla, goose, glove, glue. If you cannot find them, perhaps you can draw a picture of them.</p>
<p align="center"><b>Make up your own story</b></p>	<p align="center"><b>Where is the troll?</b></p>	<p align="center"><b>Sink or float?</b></p>
<p align="center">  </p> <p>See if you can make up your own story about a troll. You will need:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A character -A troll</li> <li>• A setting</li> <li>• A problem</li> <li>• A solution</li> </ul>	<p align="center">  </p> <p>Cut out the picture of the bridge and the troll. Can you put the troll... Under the bridge? Beside the bridge? On the bridge? Behind the bridge? In front of the bridge? Now see if when you put the troll somewhere and ask an adult to find him/her.</p>	<p align="center">  </p> <p>Fill a bowl or bucket with some water. Collect things around the home and / or outside that you do not mind getting wet. Now before you place them in the water see if you can predict if it will float or sink. Now test it in the water. You can sort the objects into a group that sinks and a group that floats</p>
